PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Adopt-A-Park is a public service program for volunteers to assist their community by picking up litter, communicating maintenance needs, and assisting in improvement projects at Champlin parks.

Help Keep



Safe and Clean!

- Adopt-A-Park is open to community groups, civic groups, churches, families, and individual citizens for a minimum period of one year.
- Park clean-up shall be performed three times a year.
- Check-list will be provided for groups to easily communicate maintenance needs to the Parks Department.
- Park sites are chosen on a first-come, first-served basis.



The City of Champlin provides:

- Trash bags.
- Pick up of full bags.
- Paint and material for special maintenance projects (if necessary and approved).
- A “*Special Thank You of Appreciation*” recognizing groups efforts will be published on city website, Champlin Chronicle and recreation brochure.
- Tips for a safe and successful clean-up.
- City Council recognition for group commitment and park clean-up.

What we ask of you:

- Pick up litter in the park area, and place the bag by the park’s litter receptacle.
- Pile up fallen branches and sticks.
- Rake safety surfaces in worn areas.
- Communicate any safety or maintenance concerns you see to Park staff immediately.
- Have fun volunteering in, and for, your Community!
