Greetings, Neighbors!

I want to begin by saying how incredibly fortunate we are to call Champlin home.

This community continues to show strength, compassion, and resilience in the face of both celebration and tragedy.

Over the past few months, I've received hundreds of messages from residents reaching out, not just to ask how I'm doing, but how the City is doing, following the horrific events of June 14, when our community was shaken by the assassination attempt on Senator John Hoffman and the tragic loss of Representative Melissa Hortman and her husband Mark. As both your Mayor and a fellow resident, I never imagined waking up to such devastating news, nor seeing our city on national headlines under these circumstances.

I want to extend my deepest thanks to our Champlin Police Department and surrounding cities for their swift and professional response. Their bravery undoubtedly prevented further loss of life. We are grateful that Senator Hoffman is recovering, and our hearts go out to the Hortman family during this unimaginable time.

Community safety is and always will be a top priority for the City Council. I have full confidence in our outstanding police force. We will continue to invest in resources, hold the line on crime, and send a clear message that Champlin is a safe and united community, and anyone who threatens that will be held accountable.

I also want to take a moment to welcome and recognize our new City Administrator, Jenny Max. She stepped into this leadership role just days before the June 14 incident and quickly proved herself to be a steady, capable, and compassionate leader. I have tremendous confidence in her ability to guide our organization forward, and the feedback from staff these past three months has been overwhelmingly positive. As Mayor, I couldn't be more confident in her leadership. We are truly fortunate to have her serving Champlin.





Understanding Right-of-Way and Easements in Champlin

Why It Matters for Your Property and City Projects

As Champlin and other utility owners continue to invest in infrastructure and street improvements, many residents are noticing activity near their yards and wondering, "Isn't that my property?" Understanding public **right-of-way (ROW)** and **easements** can help clarify what's happening and why.

What Is the Right-of-Way (ROW)?

The ROW includes streets, sidewalks, boulevards, and underground utilities and often extends 10–15 feet past the curb into what may look like your yard. While the City owns this area, **residents must mow and maintain boulevard grass** per City Code [Section 106-55 (b)].

Irrigation systems, fences, or landscaping installed in the ROW are at your own risk. These may be removed or damaged during maintenance or improvement projects such as street reconstructions and utility upgrades.



What Are Drainage and Utility Easements?

Easements allow City or utility crews to access underground infrastructure (like storm sewers, water, or gas lines). These are typically 5-10 feet wide along front, side, or rear property lines and are recorded with your plat.

Even though you own this land:

- Permanent structures are not allowed
- Changes to grading or landscaping need City approval
- Access may occur without notice or compensation for damage to unauthorized features

What You Can Do:

- Review your property survey or plat to locate easements
- Keep ROW and easement areas clear of permanent structures or deep-rooted plantings
- Always call Gopher State One Call (811) before digging



Embedded Social Worker Enhances Community Response at Champlin Police Department

During Night to Unite 2025, many residents were surprised to learn that the Police Department has an embedded social worker on staff. Our social worker was out in the community meeting residents and sharing the benefits of this innovative public safety approach. This program enhances the department's ability to respond to mental health crises, substance abuse cases, and social service needs with compassion and care.

By integrating a licensed social worker into daily operations, officers gain critical support in handling non-criminal calls more effectively. This collaborative model has helped reduce repeat calls

for service and build stronger trust between law enforcement and residents.

The embedded social worker primarily serves Champlin and works with neighboring agencies when needed. Responsibilities include conducting follow-up visits, performing crisis assessments, connecting individuals to mental health, housing, addiction, and domestic violence resources, and providing on-site support during police calls. The immediate access to services helps to de-escalate situations that might otherwise result in arrests or emergency room visits.

The success of this program reflects the value of a multidisciplinary approach to public safety. By combining law enforcement with social services, Champlin has created a more proactive, holistic model of community care. This position is a vital part of how we support residents in crisis and promote safer outcomes for everyone in the community.



In other city updates, it's been another busy construction season. Goose Lake Parkway improvements are almost complete, and we're excited to reopen the newly reconstructed 109th Avenue later this fall. It will mark the end of phase one of a two-part project. Phase two, intersection improvements at Highway 169 and 109th, will begin in 2026.

Meanwhile, it's been an exciting third year at Mississippi Crossings. The 2025 MC Summer Series was our biggest yet, with growing crowds and great energy along the riverfront. Watching residents come together to enjoy live music on the river is exactly what we envisioned when we began redeveloping this area. Later this year, we'll celebrate another milestone as CharBlu Riverside opens its doors. This long-anticipated riverfront restaurant with an outdoor patio will be a fantastic addition to the Crossings experience.

- Monthly Fee: **\$3.85**. While participation is optional, state law requires all residents with curbside service to pay this fee—just like standard recycling. This is part of Hennepin County's updated recycling ordinance (Nov. 2018).
- What's Accepted: Food scraps, compostable paper, and certified compostable products.



Charge Into Fire Safety!

Fire Prevention Week is October 5-11. This year's theme, "Charge into Fire Safety™," focuses on lithium-ion battery safety in the home. These batteries are found in phones, laptops, e-bikes, power tools, and more. Follow these simple safety steps:



- 1. Buy Smart:** Only purchase products with safety certification marks like UL, ETL, or CSA.
- 2. Charge Safely:** Use the charger that came with your device. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. Always charge on a hard surface, avoid overcharging, and unplug once fully charged.
- 3. Recycle Properly:** Never toss lithium-ion batteries in the trash. Recycle them at a certified battery recycling location — visit call2recycle.org to find one near you.

If a fire does start in your home, you'll have two to three minutes to get out. A working smoke alarm can buy you the precious seconds you and your family need to escape with your lives intact. So test your smoke alarms monthly and listen for the sound. Don't forget to change the batteries twice a year too, and establish a meeting place that's a safe distance away from your home where everyone can gather after escaping a fire.

Free Smoke Alarms and CO Alarm Safety

Carbon monoxide detectors must be replaced every 10 years and should be located near sleeping areas.
