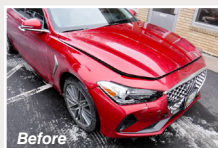

Due to underutilization, Metro Transit and the City of Champlin have decided to close this specific Park and Ride. In fact, of Champlin residents who use Park and Ride, only eight percent use the Champlin locations. Two close alternative Park and Ride options are Richardson Park in Champlin and the express Park and Ride in Brooklyn Park at 610 and Noble. The 117th and West River Road location will continue to serve as a bus route stop. The future of the location is unknown. It is zoned for single-family residential. 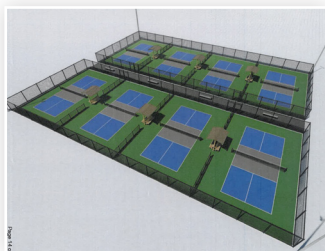
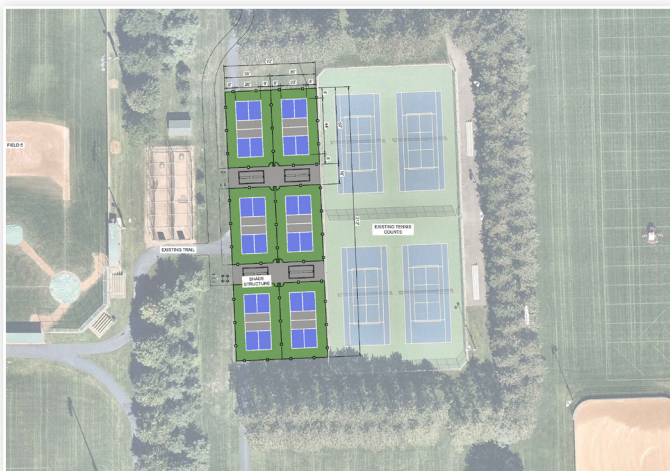

Don't Leaf the Lakes

If you look carefully, you may be able to see the first hints of fall colors spreading through the treetops. Not too long after that, you'll look out the window one day to find your entire yard covered in a medley of leaves. As beautiful as the fall leaves are, it is important to recognize that the same leaves that add color to neighborhoods can also add unwanted color to our lakes.

This fall, take time to sweep or rake leaves out of the street in front of your house. Left in the street, they can clog storm drains and contribute to local flooding. In addition, when leaves are washed into nearby lakes, rivers, and streams via storm drains or ditches, they become a major source of phosphorus, the nutrient (or "food") that allows smelly and potentially toxic algae to bloom in our favorite lakes in the summer.

Do your part for our local lakes and don't leaf the lakes you love this fall! Help protect our local lakes by collecting and properly disposing of your leaves.

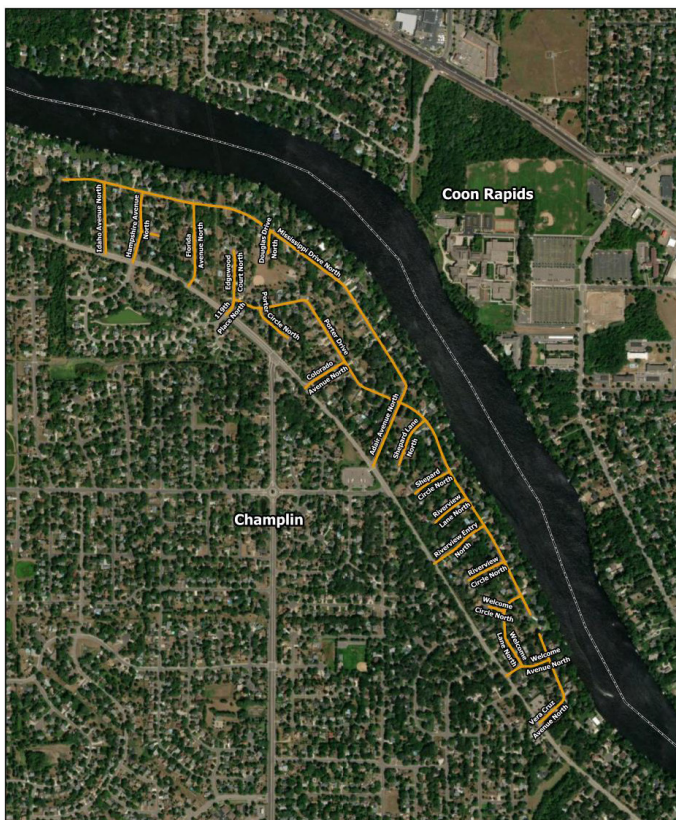

THC Licenses and Cannabis in the City



Understanding Minnesota's New Cannabis Law

A new state law allows Minnesotans aged 21 and older to legally possess and use certain amounts of cannabis and cannabis products. Under this new state law, cities have limited authority to impose additional regulations related to adult use and sales. With that in mind, City Council held a special meeting on August 21st to discuss measures to take in areas where the City does have authority, and they adopted a new ordinance banning the use of cannabis in the parks, public spaces, and on City property. The City has also established a license for low potency THC sales.

It is important to note:

- An adult cannot possess more cannabis than is legally allowed.
- Cannabis cannot be consumed on school property.
- Driving under the influence remains illegal.
- Open containers or products are not allowed in any areas of a vehicle normally occupied by the driver and passengers.
- Under 21 possession and use is illegal.
- Cannabis cannot be sold without a license. The State of Minnesota has stated that licenses to sell cannabis will not be available until 2025. However, low potency THC products, such as gummies and infused beverages, are allowed to be sold with a license from the City.

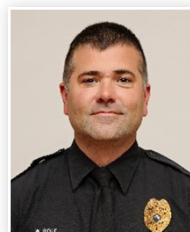
Meet Police Chief Glen Schneider

"I'm most excited about the opportunity to help the department grow and evolve while continuing to provide great service to our City. I have spent my career experiencing the different aspects of policing to prepare for this role. From patrol officer to deputy chief, I strive

Police Chief Schneider's Story:

Chief Schneider has dedicated 24+ years to our community. He started his career in Champlin as a volunteer reserve for two years after getting out of the Army in 1997. He attended Metro State University where he graduated with a degree in Law Enforcement. He was hired by Champlin as a patrol officer on December 20, 1999. He has served as a Bike Patrol Officer, Field Training Officer, Investigator, Drug Task Force Detective, and a Drug Recognition Evaluator. Schneider was promoted to Patrol Sergeant in October 2013 and performed the duties of FTO Supervisor while in this role. He was then assigned the position of Administrative Sergeant in October 2015 and held that position through December 2020 before returning to Patrol Sergeant. As an Administrative Sergeant, he helped the City achieve being recognized as Heart Safe and Beyond the Yellow Ribbon. He also worked on various internal system changes such as Body Worn Cameras and Records Management. Schneider was promoted to Deputy Chief in 2021 and now Police Chief, effective the week of July 3, 2023.



Meet Deputy Chief Weston Rolf

"I am excited to help lead this department. When I joined the Champlin Police Explorers back in high school, I never imagined I would become Deputy Chief. I look forward to moving our department forward and making it one our community can be proud of. I would

Deputy Chief Rolf's Story:

Weston Rolf started his career with the City as a Police Explorer in October 1998 and remained an active participant in the Explorer Program until April of 2001. Weston also served as a School Resource Security Officer at Champlin Park High School from August 2000 to February 2001. Weston was promoted to the full-time Community Service Officer position in February of 2001, and in August of 2004, Weston was hired as a Police Officer. Weston has served as a Patrol Officer, School Resource Officer, and Investigator. Weston has also been assigned to the following: livable housing, business liaison, pawn inspector, alcohol and tobacco compliance, D.A.R.E instructor, community outreach, and traffic officer. On October 1, 2015, Weston was promoted to Sergeant. As a Sergeant, he served as a Patrol Sergeant and in his last assignment, he served as the Investigative Sergeant for just short of six years. He is the recipient of the Champlin Police Department's Life Saving Awards (twice), Medal of Merit (twice), a Commendation Award, and a Distinguished Service Award.

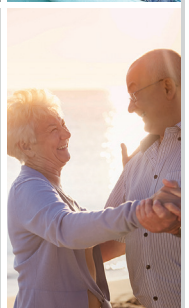

Work in Progress



Emery Village

Emery Village Reserve 4th Addition is a 40-unit condominium development located south of Goodwill and along Business Park Boulevard. The project, including four ten-

unit buildings, is essentially an extension of the Emery Village neighborhood as the layout and architectural features blend with the existing neighborhood. Construction began this past spring and now all four buildings are taking shape. Plans are to have at least two of the buildings open for occupancy this fall.



Morningside Estates

This single-family residential subdivision is located along Valley Forge Lane just north of French Lake Road (County Road 121). All homes in this new subdivision are either occupied or under construction.

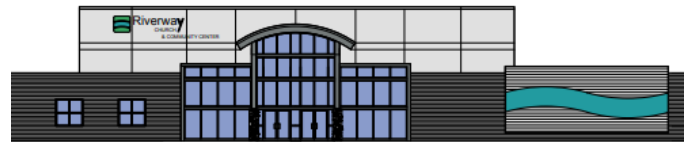


Twin City Twisters

It is hard to miss progress on the construction of Twin City Twisters' new 40,000 square foot gymnastics facility. Located just south of Willy McCoy's

restaurant on Business Park Boulevard, work began in the spring and is moving along nicely. Twin City Twisters indicates that they plan to be open by end of year.

In the Works



Riverway

Riverway Church's plans for a 40,000 square foot church facility on the northwest corner of Highway 169 and 117th Avenue were approved by the City in 2022. Riverway Church indicates that they are planning to begin construction later this year.



Mississippi Marketplace

A market concept within Mississippi Crossings for a 5,500 square-foot building located just east of The Bowline Apartments was approved by City in 2022. The market would specialize in selling ready-to-go deli items, bakery goods, coffee, fresh meats, and produce. The project team indicates that they anticipate starting construction later this year.



Mississippi Crossings Restaurant

Plans for the much anticipated Mississippi Crossings restaurant with a full-service bar, rooftop, and large patio were approved by the City in 2022. The restaurant would be designed to complement the City's outdoor performing area and would be the final phase of development in Mississippi Crossings. The anticipated developer of the restaurant is working to make the project a reality with intention to start construction late this year.

October is Fire Prevention Month

Fire Prevention Week is October 8-14 this year, and the theme is "Cooking safety starts with YOU." Here in Minnesota, residential fires most often start in kitchens, but look at any heat sources and make sure anything flammable (think magazines and newspapers, furniture, clothing, towels, or curtains) is at least three feet away from them. That applies to everything from the toaster to the furnace.



Tips from Your Anoka-Champlin Fire Department

- Look for places fires could start.
- Listen for the sound of smoke alarms.
- Learn two ways out of every room.
- Be aware of the common causes of fire.

If a fire does start in your home, you'll have two to three minutes to get out.

A working smoke alarm can buy you the precious seconds you and your family need to escape with your lives intact. So test your smoke alarms monthly and listen for the sound. Don't forget to change the batteries twice a year too, and establish a meeting place that's a safe distance away from your home where everyone can gather after escaping a fire.
