## Resident Survey

### Report of Findings

Since 2007, Champlin has conducted a phone survey of approximately 400 randomly selected residents every five years to get a perspective regarding how the community feels about the municipal services provided by the city. The invaluable feedback received from the residents serves as the framework for the community's Strategic and Financial Management planning process, and guides City leadership in the annual establishment of the General Fund Operating Budget. In the fall of 2023, a resident survey was once again completed.

### Summary:

Champlin residents are more satisfied with their community than five years ago. According to the Morris Leatherman survey group, the extremely positive reviews provided by residents rank among the highest-level positive feedback received in suburban communities in the Metropolitan area. Ratings of city services are extraordinarily high. The city enterprise is viewed strongly. City Council and staff ratings are among the top in the area. Residents rate their quality of life highly. The city does an exceptional job in communicating with residents. The city has one of the highest reservoirs of goodwill in the Metropolitan Area; the reservoir of goodwill is evolving into a "glue" tightly linking city decision-makers with residents into a consensus direction for the community.

### Residential Demographics:

Champlin remains both a growing community as well as a stabilized community, with a sizable proportion of newcomers and longer term "settlers." The median residential longevity of adult residents is 11.8 years; 32% state they have lived here for over two decades. 25% of households contain senior citizens; 19% are exclusively composed of senior citizens, almost double the level in the previous study. 86% own their homes while 13% rent. The average age of respondents is 46.5 years. 74% of respondents identify themselves as "white."

### Quality of Life:

Residents say what they "like most" about living in Champlin is "housing and neighborhoods," "small town feel," "friendly people," "good schools," and "parks and trails." "High taxes" and "traffic congestion" are listed as serious issues, however 21% see no serious issues which is three times higher than the suburban norm. 95% rate the quality of life as "excellent" or "good," which is within the top quarter of suburbs within the Metropolitan Area. 91% recommend living in Champlin to others; 96% feel accepted, valued, and welcomed in the community. Regarding aspects of the community that need improvement, some stated "more restaurants and recreational amenities;" however, 35% say "nothing" is missing.

## Greetings, Neighbors!

### State of the City

Champlin Mayor Ryan Sabas recently delivered the State of the City Address,

looking back at 2023 milestones and previewing 2024 plans. The Anoka Area Chamber of Commerce hosted the annual event in town at the Mississippi Crossings Event Center.



The biggest milestone of 2023 was launching a successful MC Summer Series. Residents can look forward to the return of live entertainment and food trucks on the river this summer. As part of the riverfront redevelopment project, City Council approved a parking lot expansion at DC Chandler Park to support overflow event parking. A full-service bakery and deli market will be coming to the area this summer. Mayor Sabas also announced that the city entered into a letter of intent with a local restaurant group to break ground on a full-service restaurant adjacent to the stage in 2024.

During his address, Sabas mentioned a note of congratulations to our local Twin Cities Twisters on their new building. He also shared that City Council initiatives continue to focus on investing in public safety, increasing staff to 30 sworn officers, as well as infrastructure improvements. He also walked attendees through the 2023-2025 road project plans.

For public recreation, he announced that the city will build an outdoor pickleball complex at Andrews Park this year. With the recent completion of the Elm Creek Stream Restoration project, residents can now kayak and fish along 2.7 miles of restored waterways.

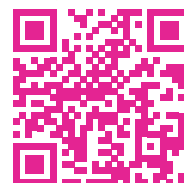
Finally, he revealed that the Father Hennepin Festival is expanding to a four-day event. New this year, Thursday will feature a free kickoff concert with Anderson Daniels at Mississippi Crossings and a \$30 unlimited carnival pass. Annual

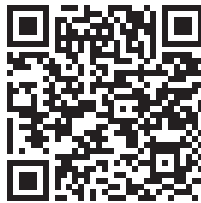

## Code Enforcement:

86% support the City taking an active approach to property maintenance and code enforcement, a 13% increase in five years. 96% rate the general condition and appearance of properties as “excellent” or “good.” 83.2% report Champlin is “about right” in its enforcement of city codes on nuisances. 76%, up nine percent in five years, find the rental licensing program effective. Respondents were reminded the city recently enacted a rental density cap. By a 58%-35% majority, residents support limiting the number of rental homes in their neighborhood. By a 54%-46% split, residents think the city should allow chickens. By a 49%-47% split, residents think the city should allow bees. These issues seemingly polarize the community, and more analysis will be needed. By a 51%-45% split, respondents support allowing golf carts on local streets.

## City Services:

The mean positive rating is 90.3%, an increase of 7.9% in five years.

\*Only two city services indicate a decrease: “snow plowing” and “police protection.” Neither are significant. According to the Morris Leatherman survey group, the primary rationale for the rating of quality and taste of drinking water are “poor taste” and “bad odor.”

## City Services and Taxes:

By a 74%-17% majority, residents support an increase in property taxes if needed to maintain services. 49%, twice the 2018 level, would be unwilling to cut services as an alternative to property tax increases. 69%-19% oppose an increase to improve and enhance services. Residents were asked to consider the proportion of property taxes paid and quality received: Champlin 82% favorable, Anoka-Hennepin School District 73% favorable, and Hennepin County 67% favorable.

## Waste Disposal and Local Environmental Issues:

The contract for organized garbage and recycling services received 96% satisfaction. If a curbside organics collection program were available for a fee, charged regardless of participation, 24% would likely take part. Residents can use the yard waste disposal site in Maple Grove without a fee; 32% use the site. 76% report awareness of lawn-sprinkling regulations.

## Public Safety:

79% rate contact with the police department as “excellent” or “good.” Responses were “prompt,” and personnel was courteous and professional. 96% report they feel safe living in Champlin; 77% rate the amount of police patrolling in their neighborhood as “about the right amount.” The most significant public safety problems are “speeding/dangerous driving,” at 28%, “drugs,” at 6%, and “car break-ins,” at 5%. 15% report no public safety concerns.

## City Government and Staff:

Citizen empowerment is at a very high level; 82% approve of the job of the Mayor and Council, which is among the highest in the Metropolitan Area. 81% approve of the job of the staff, which is among the top of suburban ratings. On customer service, 90% report staff as “excellent” or “good.” City Hall exceeds the generally accepted threshold of 80% for high quality customer service in the public sector.

## Parks and Recreation:

The rating for maintenance and condition of parks and trails was rated 98% and as “excellent” or “good.” Four out of eight facilities are used by 65% of households. Positive ratings never drop below a high 96%. Residents support the use of city funding for a multi-use indoor sports facility or dome, a second sheet of ice, and a skate park expansion.

96% report recreational programming meets their household need. Residents are likely to use a pickleball complex if one were built. Of the 66% who visited Mississippi Crossings, 98% had a favorable experience. Both the Father Hennepin Festival and Shed Fest were rated at 97% and as “excellent” or “good.”

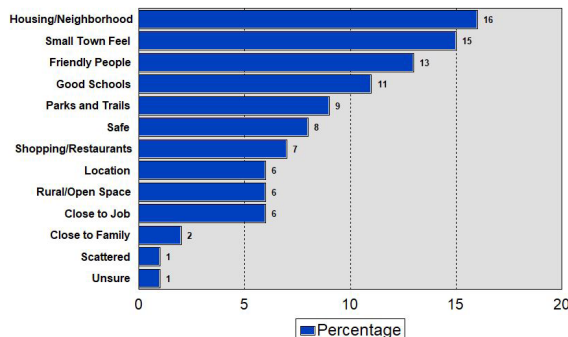
## Communications:

71% report reading the quarterly *Champlin Chronicle* as their principal source of information. 95% rate the newsletter’s quality as high. If choosing how to receive information, 43% would use the *Champlin Chronicle*, up 11% from prior survey, 19% would use the “website,” and 13% “social media.” Of the 48% who access the website, an impressive 96% highly rate the ease of navigation. Among social media outlets, Facebook, at 49%, ranks most effective for information. Only 16% report “occasionally” watching Channel SD 16 or QCTV for information.

**\*Methodology:** This study was conducted by The Morris Leatherman Company. It contains the results of 400 randomly selected adult residents. Professional interviewers conducted the survey by telephone between September 14th and October 4th, 2023. The typical respondent took 16 minutes. The non-response rate was 6%. The results are projectable to all adult residents within  $\pm 5.0\%$  in 95 out of 100 cases. 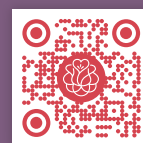

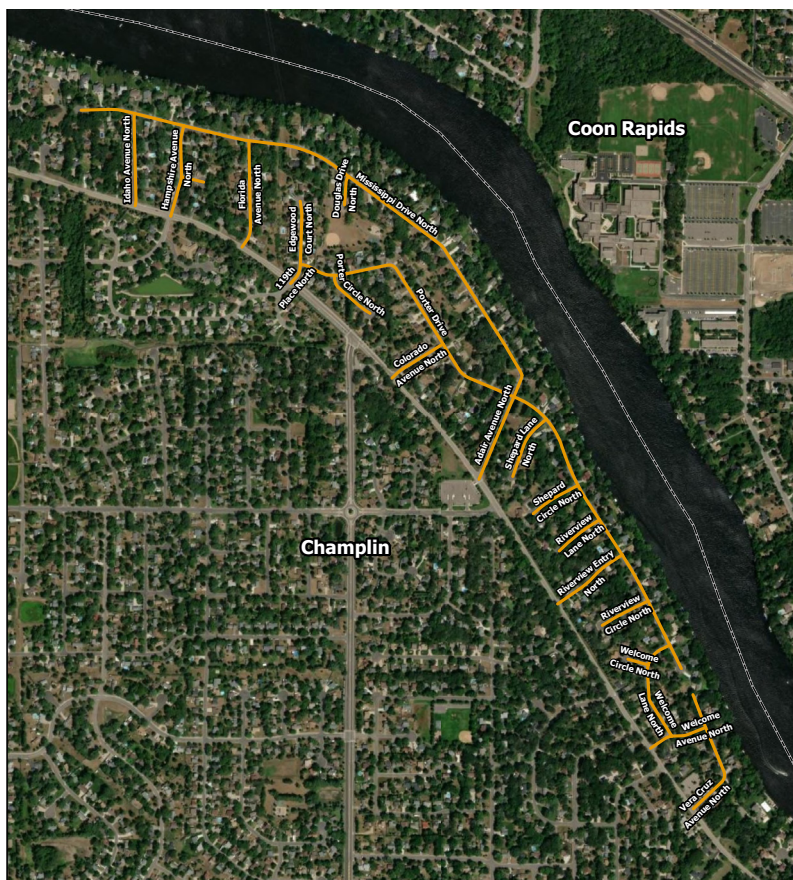


# 2024 Road Project
