Located on West River Road near 109th Avenue, the schoolhouse has stood on its original site for over 140 years. Mississippi Bridge

Constructed in 1884, the Anoka-Champlin Bridge was the first structural span of the Mississippi River between Anoka and Champlin.

The original bridge consisted of four steel spans with a wooden deck measuring eighteen feet wide. One of the spans could rotate, allowing for the passage of steamboats and other large vessels. The bridge's wood decking limited traffic capacity, and individuals received a fine of ten dollars if they crossed at a pace faster than a brisk walk.

In 1929, a new bridge replaced the old steel structure.

CHAMPLIN History

TWO RIVERS, THE RUM AND THE MISSISSIPPI, played an integral part in the area's settlement. Father Louis Hennepin first visited this area in 1680 and settlers came to stay in 1844. Prior to the 1800s, the area surrounding Champlin and Anoka was claimed by the Dakota, but later the Ojibwe pushed the Dakota westward across the Mississippi.


The Township of Marshall was organized in 1858 and a year later, Marshall reorganized into two townships, Champlin and Dayton, and the Champlin post office was established.

The name Champlin came from the family name of U.S. Navy Commodore Stephen Champlin. He was active in the war against England and Canada in 1812 and in the establishment of the Canadian-United States boundary. The commodore's daughter was married to John B. Cook, a partner of Minnesota's Alexander Ramsey. Although Cook was never a resident of Champlin, he was involved in real estate transactions here and in the incorporation of Champlin.


In 1947, a portion of the old Township of Champlin was incorporated to form the Village of Champlin. The Township of Champlin and the Village of Champlin consolidated as the result of a petitioned order from the Minnesota Municipal Commission to form the City of Champlin. The first election was held November 3, 1970. Josephine Nunn was chosen as the first mayor of the "new" City.

Champlin is located in northern Hennepin County on the west bank of the Mississippi River, about 17 miles northwest of Minneapolis. The average elevation is 875 feet above sea level, and the Mississippi River is approximately one-eighth of a mile wide. The City is approximately eight square miles in size. It is bounded by the Mississippi River on the east and north, Brooklyn Park on the south, and Dayton, Maple Grove, and the Elm Creek Park Reserve on the west.

In 1856, a ferry was established across the Mississippi River, connecting Champlin with the city of Anoka.

2024 ROAD PROJECTS

This year's project consists of 3.4 miles of street and utility improvements to the neighborhoods near or on Mississippi Drive, south of Shores Park, east of West River Road, and down to Vera Cruz Avenue. The area has been deteriorating over time, due to traffic load. The project includes street reconstruction, spot replacement of curb, trail replacement, and utility improvements. Construction began in early April and will continue through August. Construction activities will be phased to limit disruption. 

THIS MULTIPURPOSE FACILITY has two meeting rooms, one indoor and one outdoor ice sheet, skate rental, skate sharpening, and concession stand.

PUBLIC SKATE Join us for recreational skating. Skate aides/walkers are available free of charge. Bring your own skates or rent a pair for \$5. Admission is \$4 per student and \$5 per adult. A "Buy 12 Get Two Free" punch card is also available. The monthly open skate calendar can be found on the Ice Forum page of the city's website.

STICK AND PUCK Skaters and goalies work on stick handling, shooting, and individual skating skills. These are not open hockey, pickup game, or coach organized sessions. Only individual development. Helmets and respective gear are a requirement. Admission is \$7 per skater. The monthly developmental ice calendar can be found on the Ice Forum page of the city's website.

ICE FOR SALE The main rink is a 200x100 foot indoor ice surface with dasher boards, tempered glass, and six team rooms. ADULT OPEN HOCKEY Adult open hockey is Fridays 6 a.m. to 7 a.m. on a first come, first served basis. The number of players is limited to 24 and all must be 18 years or older. Hockey gear is required, and admission is \$5 per skater.

Building Permits

If you intend to build, remodel, or alter any building or structure, or make certain property improvements, a building permit may be necessary. Permits and inspections are required for electrical, plumbing, heating, and air conditioning installation. For more information, contact the Building Department at 763-421-2629.

Cable Television

Quad Cities Community Television (QCTV) is the local cable television cooperative serving Champlin, Anoka, Andover, and Ramsey. Homestead

Home Occupations

You do not need a license to operate a home-based business. You do need to follow parking, signage, noise, and other ordinances. If you have questions, contact the Associate Planner at 763-923-7104.

Water Issues

If you experience discolored water, please perform the following process:

- Go to the lowest level and run cold water full force for 3-5 minutes.
- When the water runs clear, turn on other faucets and run until clear.
- If the hot water is discolored, you may need to drain your water heater.
- If your water remains discolored after trying these methods, contact the Utilities Department at 763-421-0154, Monday through Friday 7 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. After hours, contact Hennepin County Dispatch at 952-258-5321.

For issues with low pressure or no water:

- First, verify that it affects all faucets.
- Then check an outside spigot. If there is normal pressure, you may have a restriction in your water softener. Bypass the water softener.
- If the condition remains, contact the Utilities Dept.

Sewer Backup

If you experience a sewer backup, please contact the Utilities Department at 763-421-0154, Monday through Friday 7 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. After hours, contact Hennepin County Dispatch at 952-258-5321.

Sewer Line Cleaning

Residents who have their sewer service lines cleaned or roots cut should notify the Utilities Department at 763-421-1054. An inspection of the City sanitary sewer main after the work is completed may identify potential flow issues, created from the debris removed during the maintenance. Following this procedure will help to reduce unnecessary city sanitary sewer main blockages and backups.



Snow & Ice Removal

The start time for snow removal varies depending on conditions and starts at a time deemed necessary by Public Works to ensure that "primary" arterial streets are passable by morning rush hour.

Minnesota Statutes 160.42 and 169.42 prohibit depositing snow onto public roadways. Property owners and/or occupants of any property adjacent to a public sidewalk are required to keep it free from ice and snow within 48 hours after the precipitation has ceased to fall. Residents are also encouraged to clear fire hydrants on or near their property and remove garbage bins and basketball hoops from the street during snow removal operations.

Summer Lawn Sprinkling Rules

The mandatory odd/even sprinkling ban becomes effective May 1 and continues through Labor Day. The ordinance prohibits watering between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m.

ODD-EVEN CALENDAR SPRINKLING

- Odd numbered addresses may only water on odd calendar days and even addresses on even days.
- Days begin and end at midnight.
- No sprinkling is allowed between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. You may water by hand anytime.
- New sod and seed is exempt for four weeks. Notify City offices at 763-421-0154.
- Children can run in the sprinkler anytime, but please do not leave the sprinkler running.

Single Sort Recycling

A recycling cart is provided to all homeowners. Recyclable materials may be placed into the cart without sorting. If your cart becomes damaged or lost, please contact Utility Billing for a replacement at UtilityBilling@ci.champlin.mn.us.

Collection

Recycling is collected the same day of the week as your refuse; however, it is collected every other week.

Cart Storage

Recycling and refuse containers must be properly stored in accordance with City Code Chapter 46-Solid Waste, Section 46-21(c). Carts may be stored inside, in the side yard, or in the back yard without screening. They may not be stored in the front yard.

Yard Waste Disposal Options

Contact your hauler directly to sign up for curbside service. There is the option of full season, half season, and one-time pickup. If you do not know which hauler you have been assigned, contact the Utility Billing Department at UtilityBilling@ci.champlin.mn.us.

WASTE SORTING

Organic



The City of Champlin is working on implementing a low-cost Organics Recycling Program. Currently, residents who are interested in organics recycling should contact their hauler directly to order service.

Customers will receive a cart for organics and collection will be weekly on Fridays. The haulers will bill the customer directly. The price of the service is \$60 per month but may be reduced as the number of participants increases. Hennepin County residents can also drop off organics for free recycling at the Hennepin County Recycling Center in Brooklyn Park.

Billing

Water, sewer, garbage, recycling, streetlights, and storm water services are billed the first week of each month.

Owners of Rental Property

The City will bill renters of properties in Champlin as a courtesy service. However, any unpaid charges imposed against occupants/renters of the rental property remain the responsibility of the property owner.

Vacating a Property

If you are planning to vacate your home, you are encouraged to notify the City utility billing office to request a final meter read. If the heat supply is also being shut off, it is highly recommended that the water service be turned off at the curbstop (street).

Round-Up Program

Consider rounding your bill up to the next dollar to support Parks & Recreation sponsored activities, events, and programs in our community. Sign up online by using the Utility Billing icon.

Garbage Services

The City has contracted weekly collection with Champlin Refuse Inc. (CRI), a consortium of two companies, each assigned to a specific territory for single-family homes through four-unit townhouses. Owners of larger residential complexes and commercial buildings are required to contract directly with a service provider for garbage and recycling services.

Because the City processes billing, please contact us when setting up new service, moving out of your home, or changing cart sizes. For lost or damaged carts, use the **Replace/Exchange My Refuse Bin** form found online to get one free replacement. Residents should contact haulers directly for service questions such as a missed pickup or if the cart wasn't emptied.



Zoning

The City is zoned for specific uses and regulated by the Champlin Subdivision and Zoning Ordinance. Local, state, and federal regulations apply to all land alterations or construction within 100 feet of the Mississippi River and in flood plain/flood fringe areas.

If you intend to build, remodel, or alter an existing house or business, make certain property improvements, or change the use of the land, you are asked to contact the Community Development Department to ensure that all requirements and regulations are met.

A Homeowner's Guide to Building Permits

If you are planning your own project, here is the information you'll need for obtaining a permit.

WHEN IS A PERMIT NEEDED? A building permit gives you legal permission to start construction of a building project in accordance with approved drawings and specifications. Building permits are needed to construct, alter, repair, move, convert, or demolish any building or structure except as exempted within city code. Building permits must be obtained prior to commencement of work.

THE PERMIT Once you have been approved for a permit, you have legal permission to start construction. An experienced code official is available to you should you have any questions concerning your project. You should consider your code official as an ally who will help you make your project a success. Normally, separate permits are required for electrical, plumbing, and heating or air-conditioning work.

REVIEW PROCESS The Building Official and/or Building Inspector will review your plans and determine if your project is in compliance with local requirements. If your plans meet these requirements, a permit is issued. If not, the code official may suggest solutions to help correct the problem.

JOB SITE VISITS On-site inspections will be required to make certain the work conforms to the permit, local codes, and plans. Again, you will have access to the expertise of the code official to help you with questions or concerns regarding the project and to ward off potentially costly mistakes. The code official will let you know approximately how many inspections may be needed for your project. Usually, a one- or two-day notice is needed when requesting visits.

FINAL APPROVAL The code official will provide documentation when construction is complete and code compliance is determined. You will then have the personal satisfaction of a job done right. Enjoy your new surroundings with the peace of mind and the knowledge that they meet the safety standards in your community.

CITY ORDINANCES FOR Public Safety



Dog Licenses

Licenses are required for all dogs over six months of age. Dogs must be leashed or under the control of a responsible person. Dogs running at-large will be picked up.

Emergency Management Program

The Director of the Emergency Management Program is the Police Chief. There are six outdoor Early Warning sirens placed throughout the City to alert residents of a potential emergency situation such as a natural, technological, or biological event.

Snowmobiles, ATVs, UTVs, and Dirt Bikes

These types of vehicles may only be used on private lots and riders must adhere to certain standards. They shall not be operated on public property, streets, trails, or sidewalks.

House Checks

If you are going on vacation, the police department tries to give extra patrol and house checks as time permits. Put your residence on the house check request list by filling out the form online at ci.champlin.mn.us/FormCenter/Police-Department-12/Home-Security-Check-59.

GOLF CARTS

A permit is required to operate a golf cart on approved city roadways in Champlin. Scan to apply for a permit through the police department.

Curfew

The City of Champlin enforces a nighttime curfew for persons under the age of 18 with the following restrictions:

JUVENILES UNDER THE AGE OF 12:

Sunday through Thursday, home by 9 p.m. and Friday and Saturday, home by 10 p.m. unless accompanied by a parent or guardian

JUVENILES 12-14 YEARS:

Sunday through Thursday, home by 10 p.m. and Friday and Saturday, home by 11 p.m. unless accompanied by a parent or guardian

JUVENILES 15-17 YEARS:

Sunday through Thursday, home by 11 p.m. and Friday and Saturday, home by midnight unless accompanied by a parent or guardian

PARKING LOT EXCHANGE ZONE

In response to questions about safe locations for the exchange of items purchased through internet garage sale type sites, the Champlin Police Department installed additional surveillance cameras and created an "Exchange Zone" in our parking lot. The Exchange

Zone can also be utilized as a child custody exchange site. Users should be aware that the site is under recorded video surveillance, but it is not actively monitored.

The Exchange Zone is on the east side of the police department parking lot, along Champlin Drive. It is marked by a green sign. We ask that you try to stay as close as possible to the area marked by the sign. That is where the camera coverage is the best and it will also be the least disruptive to other Police Department traffic.

Parking Regulations

No motor vehicle shall be parked within the City in the following places:

- On any public street or right-of-way between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m.
- Within 10 feet of a fire hydrant, in a public alley, or within 10 feet of a mailbox between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday
- In the front yard or side yard except on a paved driveway
- Recreational vehicles cannot be parked within five feet of the rear property line. For a complete list of regulations, visit the city website.

Vacant Building Registration

The Champlin City Council has adopted a Vacant Building Registration (VBR) program requiring vacant building owners to register their property. A vacant building is defined as a residential or nonresidential building that has been unoccupied for at least 60 days. Townhomes and condominiums are required to be registered as well. Tall Grass and Noxious Weeds

Each property owner has the responsibility of destroying noxious weeds growing on their land. If weeds are not destroyed within a specific time limit, they will be destroyed by the City and the costs will be charged to the property owner. Noxious weeds include field bindweed (creeping jenny), leafy spurge, bull thistle, Canada thistle, sow thistle, plumeless thistle, purple loosestrife, musk thistle, and poison ivy. Grasses growing to a height greater than eight inches or which have gone or are about to go to seed are considered a public nuisance. Fire Department

THE CITY OF CHAMPLIN IS PART OF A JOINT POWERS FIRE DISTRICT that shares fire services with the City of Anoka. This agreement began with Champlin in 1985. The Fire Department is a combination department with both full-time and paid-on-call firefighters. The fire chief, two assistant chiefs, and a full-time captain make up the full-time staffing with the assistance of a part-time fire department administrative assistant. The paid-on-call division consists of 45 firefighters who respond to calls when available. There are two stations, one in each city.

High Fire Danger

Wildland fire season may be the worst in recorded history. The state of Minnesota has witnessed one of the warmest winters in the past 50 years. With little snow pack and mild temperatures, the local fire departments have been updated by the MN DNR that this wildland fire season could be one of the worst in recorded history. Currently the Twin Cities and surrounding counties have been placed in a High Fire Danger, meaning that fires start easily

and spread at a fast rate. Anoka-Champlin asks all residents to be mindful of any controlled burns. The ACFD has taken delivery of two new grass rigs that will be outfitted with wildland fire tools and suppression capabilities. Along with two UTVs, the fire department will be well prepared for any type of wildland fire.

Replace Alarm Batteries

The fire department recommends replacing all smoke alarm and CO alarm batteries and testing devices twice a year. Smoke and CO alarms have a 10-year life span and each have a born on date printed on the back of the device. Please replace devices if older than 10 years of age. The ACFD will be conducting its first Sound the Alarm event in conjunction with the American Red Cross. Watch for updates on the ACFD Facebook page.

Radon Tests

The ACFD now has free Radon test kits for residents living in Anoka or Champlin. Contact the fire department to inquire about a kit.

Recreational Fires

City ordinance allows residents to have outdoor recreational fires. A copy of the ordinance or a highlight sheet is available by calling the Anoka-Champlin Fire Department at 763-576-2900. Here is an overview of the ordinance:

- Burning shall be allowed between 9 a.m. and midnight.
- The fire shall not exceed three feet in diameter and a flame height of approximately two feet.
- Only clean wood or charcoal may be burned. No burning of trash, leaves, or brush is allowed.
- Only approved starter fluids may be used to ignite the fire.

- A person knowledgeable in the use of fire extinguishing equipment must constantly attend the fire, and an attendant must supervise the fire until the fire has been totally extinguished.
- Fire extinguishing equipment such as buckets, shovels, or

garden hoses must be readily available.

- The fire must not be conducted within 15 feet of any structure or property line, or combustible material.
- Outdoor burning must be contained in a fireplace/fire ring.



The City of Champlin completed redistricting in 2022. As a result of state redistricting, Champlin will now be in State House Districts 34A and 34B. This results in Ward 4 being split into two precincts, to allow for two legislative districts. Ward 4 residents living on the west side of Douglas will be in Precinct 1 and Ward 4 residents living on the east side of Douglas will be in Precinct 2. Please note, the Ward 4 polling location will remain at Jackson Middle School. Both Precincts 1 and 2 will vote at Jackson Middle School, but in separate gyms.

Our Place to Live: RESIDENT SURVEY

IN 2007, THE CITY OF CHAMPLIN INSTITUTED A PHONE SURVEY, TO BE CONDUCTED EVERY FIVE YEARS, OF APPROXIMATELY 400 RANDOMLY SELECTED RESIDENTS. The survey gauges how the community views municipal services. This feedback serves as the framework for strategic planning and financial management and guides City leadership when preparing the annual General Fund Operating Budget.

The 2023 survey resulted in good news: Champlin residents are more satisfied with their community than five years ago. In fact, the extremely positive reviews rank among the highest-level feedback received in suburban communities in the Metropolitan area.

Highlights include:

- Extraordinarily high ratings of city services
- Strong view of the city enterprise
- Top ratings of City Council and city staff
- High quality of life
- Exceptional communication from the city to residents
- One of the highest reservoirs of goodwill in the Metropolitan Area

Areas of some concern included high taxes, traffic congestion, and the need for more restaurants and recreational amenities.

Overall, 95 percent of residents surveyed rated the quality of life as excellent or good, among the top quarter of suburbs in the Metropolitan area, and 91 percent recommend "our place to live" to others.





ThreeRivers PARK DISTRICT

THREE RIVERS PARK DISTRICT SERVES OVER 12 MILLION VISITORS annually and manages 27,000 acres of park reserves, regional parks, regional trails, and special-use facilities.

There are facilities and activities for every season: picnicking, swimming, play areas, boating, fishing, downhill skiing, snow tubing, snowboarding, golfing, and camping.

Three Rivers has developed an extensive trail system for hiking, biking, in-line skating, horseback riding, mountain biking, cross-country skiing, and snowshoeing. Three Rivers also offers outdoor recreation and education programs for all ages.

REGIONAL TRAILS

The Rush Creek Regional Trail is nine miles of paved trail linking Elm Creek Park Reserve to Coon Rapids Dam Regional Park in Brooklyn Park.

The 15 paved miles of the Medicine Lake Regional Trail are great for hiking and biking and connect Elm Creek Park Reserve with Fish Lake Regional Park. The trail also connects to French Regional Park and the Luce Line Regional Trail.

ELM CREEK PARK RESERVE

12400 James Deane Parkway

The largest park in Three Rivers, Elm Creek features amenities for all seasons. The Elm Creek Winter Recreation Area is home to lighted cross-country ski trails, a tubing hill, and a downhill ski and snowboard hill with terrain park and snowmaking. The swim pond, expansive play area, and fenced dog off-leash area are popular destinations. Its 18-hole disc golf course, archery range, and 12-mile single track mountain bike trail attract those seeking a challenge. The 19 miles of paved trails make it a great place for hiking and biking.

EAGLE LAKE REGIONAL PARK


DAYTON IS A COMMUNITY WITH A RURAL FEEL and the advantage of being close to the city. Dayton's motto has become "Live the difference."

OUR Past

THE CITY OF DAYTON is located at the northwestern corner of Hennepin County, with a small portion of the City on the very eastern side of Wright County. The Mississippi River flows along the City's northern boundary, and the Crow River lies on the western boundary. Dayton is a developing community with documented historical roots reaching back to the year when Minnesota became a state.

A majority of the initial group of settlers in Dayton were predominantly French, and some were of Irish, Scottish, and German descent. Many descendants of the original settlers still live in Dayton and surrounding communities.

The City was named for Lyman Dayton, who completed platting for the area often referred to as our Historic Village. While there were many important pioneers in Dayton's early years, a few notable names can be seen to this day in our parks and street names, including Baxter, Robinson, McNeil, and Goodin.

The farmland surrounding the village was once considered a township, and a Town Hall was constructed on land donated by the Dahlheimer family. The Village of Dayton and Dayton Township eventually joined together, forming the City of Dayton, which was incorporated in 1975.

St. John the Baptist Church (located in the Historic Village) has been an important cornerstone of Dayton's history for over a century. Many years ago, the Church compiled a cookbook containing not only recipes, but also historical information and stories from Dayton's earliest families. Copies are available at Dayton City Hall, or directly through the office of St. John the Baptist Church. Additional information on Dayton's history can also be found through the Hennepin County Historical Society.

Governing Body

The City of Dayton is governed by a Council consisting of a Mayor and four Council Members. The City Council meets twice each month at 6:30 p.m. at Dayton City Hall. See City website for meeting dates.

The City has two advisory commissions to assist the Council in the decision-making progress. The Commissions – Park and Planning – meet once per month, or as needed, and consist of residents of Dayton.

The City has an EDA Commission which consists of two Council Members and five Community Business Members.

City Newsletter

Dayton Communicator is the City's newsletter. It is published six times per year and mailed to residents. It is also available on the City website. This provides the latest updates on City projects and activities. Community activities can be found on the City's website as well as our City's Official Facebook page.



CITY Information

DAYTON IS COMPRISED of approximately 25 square miles located 30 miles northwest of Minneapolis and 40 miles northwest of St. Paul.

The City of Dayton is classified by the Metropolitan Council as an "Emerging Suburban" community. Emerging Suburban communities are the cities in which a substantial amount of the region's growth will occur – about 60 percent of new households and 40 percent of new jobs.

As the metropolitan area has grown, Dayton has begun to serve as a suburban bedroom community for an increasing number of residents. Many of Dayton's residents find employment outside of the community in Minneapolis, St. Paul, or nearby Maple Grove, which has experienced significant employment growth in recent years. A large portion of Dayton's residents are young families with children.

Dayton also provides a wide variety of recreational opportunities for residents. The Elm Creek Park Reserve makes up a large portion of Dayton. The Mississippi and Crow Rivers provide additional recreational opportunities and are significant natural features of the community. These features provide important ecological and recreational benefits for the community and the region. Residents also take advantage of Dayton's vast open spaces for snowmobiling and other recreational activities.

Currently, Dayton is largely a rural community with a relatively small population and large agricultural areas. Dayton has a Historic Village area where many of the first developments in

Dayton occurred. The Historic Village is located in the northwest corner of the City, near the confluence of the Crow and Mississippi Rivers.

The City of Dayton has a range of community services and facilities to serve its residents including Fire, Police, and Public Works Departments and an elementary school. Learn more about the departments and public safety on page 41.

RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT: Dayton has a population of about 9,200 (2022). Residential developments under construction include Brayburn Trails, Cypress Cove, Lone Gardens, Riverwalk, Sundance Greens, and Territorial Commons. 237 single-family homes and 129 townhomes were built in 2023 and 261 homes and 60 townhomes in 2022.

DAYTON BUSINESSES: New businesses include Cubes (available 1 million sq ft warehouse/distribution), Dayton-94 (available 330,000 sq ft warehouse/distribution), Graco distribution, House of Elite (personal training), Kwik Trip, Minnesota Towing (including A to Z Towing and Sell a Junker), nVent distribution, Pro Flat Fee Realty, and Ziegler Truck Group.

COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT: New commercial/industrial development approved or under construction include Curbside, MTL, Opus (130,000 sq ft warehouse/distribution), QT Commercial Roofing, and French Lake Architectural (glass).

WELLHEAD TREATMENT GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY

The City celebrated a Groundbreaking Ceremony for the future site of the Dayton Wellhead Treatment Plant. This will treat Dayton municipal water to a level that exceeds all standards set by the MN Department of Health. The treatment plant has been discussed for several years and began to gain momentum after the City was awarded a \$4 million grant by the Federal Government and subsequently a \$1.75 million grant by the State of Minnesota. Over the past two years City of Dayton staff along with Council and our Consultants, Black & Veatch, have worked together to transform this project from a facility identified on our CIP to an approved project with shovels in the ground. The construction phase of the project has recently begun; the project is expected to be substantially complete by January of 2025.

OUR COMMUNITY IS A LEGALLY ESTABLISHED CITY under the laws of Minnesota. A Mayor who serves a two-year term and four Council Members who serve four-year terms govern the City of Dayton. City elections are held in the fall of all even-numbered years. Council Members serve the community at large; there are no wards.

The four Council Members and the Mayor are responsible for approving operating and capital improvement budgets, employing City workers, establishing City regulations and ordinances, maintaining public facilities, and planning for the City's future.

Council meetings are held twice a month at 6:30 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers, 12260 South Diamond Lake Rd., Dayton, MN 55327. All meetings (with the exceptions limited by law) are open to the public. During the Council meeting, there is a designated time at the beginning of the meeting called Open Forum when the general public may speak to the Council about items not listed on the Council agenda. The Council will not take action regarding Open Forum issues until a later Council meeting or may refer the issue to staff. All meetings are provided via livestream for the general public to watch live. Additionally, all meetings are available on the City's YouTube Channel.

The Planning Commission meets the first Thursday of the month, as needed, at 6:30 p.m. The Commission helps implement City plans by making recommendations to the City Council on long-range planning issues such as land use and transportation. It also advises on matters such as changes and enforcement of the Zoning Ordinances, City Comprehensive Plan, and Zoning Map.

Most resident contact with the Planning Commission comes from the Public Hearing for Conditional Use Permits and variances from the Zoning Ordinances. The Commission forwards the information from these hearings along with its recommendations to the City Council for final action. At this time, the City consults with Landform for planning services.

EDA/HRA Commission

The EDA/HRA meets the third Tuesday of the month, as needed, at 7:30 a.m. The EDA Commission has an open seat available. Applications are available at City Hall or online at cityofdaytonmn.com.

The Public Works Department is responsible for road maintenance (including snowplowing, sanding, sweeping, striping, street signs, seal coating, and pothole patching), storm and sanitary sewer, water, City vehicles, some engineering work, and all City park and building maintenance.

The semi-annual water main flushing program occurs every fall and spring. The process of flushing the water system may result in low water pressure, cloudy or discolored water during the days the system is being flushed. The discolored water is not dangerous to your health. Please be aware of the water quality while doing laundry or other tasks that require rust-free water. Flushing fire hydrants and water mains provide several benefits to the water users of our systems including improving water quality and verifying operation for maintenance or repair.

The department has a Chief, Lieutenant, Sergeant, Investigator, nine Patrol Officers, CSO, Office Manager, and an Administrative Assistant. The department also has a police reserve program with volunteer members available to assist the Dayton Police Department. The Department is responsible for law enforcement, crime prevention programs, and investigations. The Department also provides a number of community services such as Neighborhood Watch, National Night Out, and Operation Identification.

PARKING PERMITS

Parking on streets in the City of Dayton is prohibited between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. without a permit. Residents may obtain up to three permits free of charge. Residents can come into the Police department, with ID showing proof of residency, to fill out an application.

Neighborhood Watch counts on citizens to organize themselves and work with law enforcement to keep a trained eye and ear on their communities while demonstrating their presence at all times of day and night. Neighborhood Watch works because it reduces opportunities for crime to occur; it doesn't rely on altering or changing the criminal's behavior or motivation. Dayton Water Trail Project

The City of Dayton is working with MSA Professional Services to develop a designated water route intended to be used by canoes and kayaks. Water trails allow users the option to access the water safely by providing ADA-compliant access points. The four bodies of water under consideration for part of the trail include the Mississippi and Crow rivers and Diamond and French lakes.

Park Improvement Projects

Three parks have been selected for improvements or development this year. All of the projects are being developed by a consultant landscape architect. The project will be bid in the spring with construction expected in the summer and substantial completion by fall of 2024. The following parks have been selected: Area 21 Park is located close to 117th Ave. and is an assemblage of lots from three developments. Elsie Stephens Park was presented to the Park Commission and several comments and suggestions were recommended to incorporate into design. Cypress Cove & Lone Gardens Park was adopted by the City in 2023 and is being reimagined with improved landscaping, irrigation installation, and possibly a shelter structure.

Parks & Recreation

The City has many parks that are well maintained and provide facilities for sports, recreation, and relaxation. There is playground equipment for the kids, walking trails, pickleball courts, basketball half-courts, baseball fields, pavilions for rent, grills, park benches and tables for picnics, and plenty of mowed grass areas to enjoy.

Central Park and Brianna Scurry Soccer Field

12260 S. Diamond Lake Rd.

Central Park and Brianna Scurry Soccer Field, off of South Diamond Lake Road, is a big area with soccer fields, ball fields, hockey rink, parking lot, and plenty of mowed grass area.

Cloquet Overlook Park

13900 Dayton River Rd. [C.R. 12]

Cloquet Overlook Park, on Dayton River Road, has walking trails, benches and picnic tables, grills, and children's playground equipment.

Diamond Lake Diamonds Park

16471 S. Diamond Lake Rd.

Features a youth ball field. This park has a walking trail that connects to Elsie Stephens Park.

Donahue Dells Park

12931 Arrowood Ln. N.

This is a small neighborhood park that has children's playground equipment and seating.

Elsie Stephens Park

14430 Dayton River Rd.

Elsie Stephens Park features a pergola, paved seating area, performance amphitheater with electric service, limestone terracing

and seating, steps to a river view platform, lighting within the park area, and landscaping. The City will host events such as family fun night and a concert in the park in the summer.

Goodin Park

17330 Dayton River Rd. [C.R. 12]

Goodin Park, on Dayton River Road, has grills, benches, and a path leading down to the Mississippi River.

Hayden Hills Park

11510 Pineridge Way N.

Hayden Hills Park features children's playground equipment, pickleball courts, basketball half-court, baseball field, putting green, and trails.

Leathers Park

14021 Balsam Ave. N.

Leathers Park features trails through natural prairie grasses. Currently is being reseeded with native seed mixes to show various prairie plants.

McNeil Park

15981 Shadyview Ln.

McNeil Park, in the Historic Village, has a ball field, picnic tables, concession stand, and children's playground equipment.

Old Orchard Park

13590 Vinewood Ln. N.

A boardwalk connects Vinewood Lane to 137th Avenue and into the trail network constructed as part of the Pineview Meadows Development.

Riversbend Park

13010 141st Ave.

Riversbend Park has a ball field and children's playground equipment which features a zip line.

River Hills Park

14659 River Hills Pkwy.

River Hills Park features a zip line, playground equipment, basketball half-court, pickleball court, picnic areas, shelters, pollinator garden, and looped walking trail. The park also benefits from an underpass access to Elsie Stephens Park and Cloquet Island Overlook Park.

Sundance Woods Park

11000 Sundance Woods Blvd.

Sundance Woods Park has playground equipment, shelter, basketball half-court, and a ball field.

Susan McLean Park

Mississippi River overlook, located in the Historic Village, includes a beautiful gazebo for a picnic by the Mississippi River.

Wildwood Springs Park

11800 Stoneridge Rd.

Wildwood Springs offers disc golf.

Hiring a Contractor

Make sure the contractor has a state license for residential construction. Check references and find out how long they have been in business in the area. Call the Better Business Bureau to see if any complaints have been registered. The contractor should sign the application, making them guarantee the work meets the code.

Doing the Work Yourself

Detailed plans of what you are proposing to construct are required. If your proposed work does not meet codes, it is easier to change it on paper than after you have built it.

Never dig on your property without first having Gopher State One Call locate the underground utilities (651-454-0002). This is a free service that may save your life.

A BUILDING PERMIT IS REQUIRED WHEN:

- Building or remodeling a house
- Putting up a shed larger than 200 square feet
- Installing a fireplace, wood stove, or chimney
- Finishing your basement
- Adding a garage or addition
- Window replacement
- Changing or installing heating or air conditioning
- Installing plumbing/new water heater or water softener
- Constructing a swimming pool
- Putting up a deck or porch
- Doing electrical work (electrical permits are through the state; call 763-241-2102)
- All commercial/industrial work
- Reroof/re-siding
- Fence
- Doors
- Water heaters
- Water softeners
- Furnaces

A BUILDING PERMIT IS NOT REQUIRED FOR:

- Hanging gutters
- Movable cases, counters, and partitions not over 5 ft. 9 in. high
- Retaining walls under 4 ft. 9 in. high
- Platforms and walks not over 30 inches above grade and not over a basement or story below
- Painting, wallpapering, or paneling
- Temporary stage sets and scenery
- Soffit, fascia, and trim
- Installing carpeting or other flooring
- Window awnings not projecting more than 54 inches
- Redecorating without structural change






