#### **First Time Homebuyers Start Up Program**

- Income limits up to \$142,800 based on county.
- House price purchase limits up to \$515,200
- Must be owner-occupied
- Downpayment and Closing Cost Loan options – up to \$18,000 available

#### **Repeat Homebuyer & Refinance Step Up Program**

- Income limits up to \$185,700 based on county
- House price limits up to \$515,200
- Must be owner-occupied
- Downpayment and Closing Cost Loan options – up to \$18,000 available

#### **Down Payment & Closing Cost Loan Program**

- Loans up to \$18,000
- Must be repaid in full
- Can only be used with a Minnesota Housing first mortgage and have eligibility requirements. Check the website above for more details.

#### **Fix Up Home Improvement Loan Program**

- Loan amounts from \$2,000 to \$75,000
- Secured and unsecured loan options
- Little to no equity in your home needed
- Hire a contractor or do the work yourself
- No prepayment penalty
- Check the website above for eligibility requirements and projects

#### **Rehabilitation Loan Program & Emergency and Accessibility Loan Programs**

- Assist low-income homeowners with home improvements that address emergency conditions of the home or accessibility needs for a household resident with a disability.
- Maximum loan amount is \$37,500
- Maximum loan term is 15 years

**Fix Up Fund Home Improvement Loan**

- Must be owner occupied
- Income Limit
- Loan amounts from \$2,000-\$75,000
- Financing available for 100% of project costs

**Unsecured Home Improvement Loan**

- Income Limit
- Loan amounts from \$2,000 to \$25,000
- Terms from 3 to 10 years
- This loan is NOT secured by a mortgage on your property
- Financing available for 100% of project costs

**Family Housing Fund Post-Purchase 2-4 Unit Loan Program**

- 2-4 unit owner-occupied residential properties
- Loan amounts from \$1,000 to \$10,000
- Terms from 1 to 7 years
- Financing available for 100% of project costs
- Closing costs apply
- Income limits apply

**Secured Home Energy Loan**

- Most energy related improvements are eligible including heating and cooling systems, windows, water heaters, and insulation
- No maximum income limits
- Loan amounts up to \$60,000
- Terms up to 20 years

**Unsecured Home Energy Loan**

- Most energy related improvements are eligible including heating and cooling systems, windows, water heaters, and insulation
- This loan is NOT secured by a mortgage to your property
- No maximum income limits
- Loan amounts up to \$30,000
- Terms from 3 to 10 years

**Home Repair Program:**

- Must have a household income that is at or below 50% of the area median income as determined by HUD
- At least 1 resident of the home must be older than 55, living with a disability, a child under the age of 18, or an active or retired member of the armed services
- Must plan to remain in home for at least five years
- Additional qualification criteria may apply based on geographic location

**Safe at Home Program:**

- Provides home safety and fall prevention modifications and ramps for older adults or those living with a disability so they can continue to live safely and independently in their own homes.
- Must have a household income that is at or below 50% of the area median income as determined by HUD
- At least 1 resident of the home must be older than 55 or living with a disability
- Must plan to remain in home for at least 2 years
- Additional qualification criteria may apply based on geographic location
