- Call to Order                      The Champlin City Council met in Worksession and was called to order by Mayor Ryan Sabas at 6:15 p.m.
- Roll Call                            Present were Mayor Ryan Sabas and Councilmembers Jessica Tesdall (Ward 1), Tom Moe (Ward 2), Nate Truesdell (Ward 3) and Tim LaCroix (Ward 4).

- Approval of Agenda

Motion                              Motion by Councilmember LaCroix and seconded by Councilmember Truesdell to approve the agenda for the February 10, 2025 Worksession Meeting as presented. - Council Code of Conduct  
Discussion                        The City Attorney provided background information that was reviewed at the January 27<sup>th</sup> worksession with the Council. He then reviewed the draft Code of Conduct Policy that he prepared based on the previous direction of the City Council and answered any additional questions of the Council.

- Review 2025 Legislative  
Worksession Priorities           The City Administrator provided background information on the worksession that was held with legislators on Friday, January 31<sup>st</sup>. He stated that the intent tonight is to establish a list of the 2025 Legislative Priorities for Champlin. He noted the direction from Senator Hoffman and Representative Nadeau regarding the current status of affairs at the Capital and that the session may not realistically get underway until possibly mid-March, therefore recommending that the City minimize and prioritize the potential list of requests for the 2025 Legislative session.
- The City Engineer provided additional details on road projects, secured funding, and potential funding.
